SUMMARY

The report of the Dadé Kaolé Association is a document outlining all its activities between 2022 and 2023. It is an essay written at 60% by the Deputy Coordinators, NKOPANI Yverick and LIME Brigitte, from the Baka communities of the Messok Sub-Division. This approach is part of a long-learning process which aims to put indigenous peoples at the center of the association's activities by empowering them with the necessary tools to take charge of the development of their communities.

This very first attempt is intended to be a blueprint that will hopefully change the narrative with regards to the improvement of the conditions of their communities. We remain convinced that advocating for the sustainable promotion of the interests of the Baka people will necessarily involve the training of a Baka elite who over time, will be able to draft and set up viable projects to submit to various technical and financial partners.

Last year, with an amount of 840,000 (Eight Hundred and Forty Thousand) Francs CFA, the association carried out 14 activities which have improved several aspects of the community life of the Baka in Messok. As a first step, it was necessary to inform and create awareness campaigns around all the villages and camps via the Dadé Kaolé association.

Secondly, it was necessary to present and affiliate the association with various platforms which advocate for the interests of existing indigenous peoples. Education-wise, initiatives aimed at supporting and accompanying Baka students have been carried out. Our active participation in the preparation of the MoV between MINFOF and the BAKA people contributed in safeguarding the interests and natural habitats of the Bakas. In accordance with our health plan, this year made it possible to organize cleaning campaigns every three months and install wells in order to minimize waterborne diseases they tend to face. Finally, a great awareness on NTFPs has been conducted in order to create a productive economic sector benefitting this community.



INTRODUCTION

Development is an economic and social change that comes with an increase in the cost of living standards. It is about expanding opportunities for everyone to choose the life that suits them, to live long and healthy, to acquire knowledge and to have access to the resources necessary for a decent existence and to be able to participate in the life of the community. This definition is indeed perceptible among the Bantu people, whose living conditions have improved, unlike those of the indigenous people, where regression and negative impacts are more visible. It becomes clear that development as defined above is not compatible with the inhabitants of the forest who find themselves trapped in a movement where they are more victims than actors.

Having no empowerment tools to adapt to this rapid economic and social transformation, the BAKA live in a dilemma. Indeed, development projects or programs take very little or no account of their way of life and wellbeing. They are rarely represented and have no influence where decisions that affect them are taken, almost absent in the design and implementation of various projects and programs of which they are supposed to be the beneficiaries. This modus operandi does not contribute to the improvement of the conditions of the latter, because it renders them perpetually dependent.

In the face of such challenges, the Dadé Kaolé Association, created in January 2022, quickly understood the need to reorganize the way projects are designed. The use of Free, Prior Informed Consent (FPIC) puts the Baka at the center of the development and implementation of their projects. We actively campaign for the creation of an empowered Baka Elite capable of taking charge of their community and developing it according to their terms.

This report is proof that we can trust these young elite who deserve to be encouraged and followed up, so that they can take charge of their own development. This report equally presents the different activities carried out during the year 2022 that were marked by the affiliation of the new association to several platforms of indigenous people where a strong awareness regarding changes and improvements were created. Emphasis was also placed on the need for self-determination with plans to create a Baka chiefdom in the Messok subdivision. Awareness campaigns on the need to obtain birth certificates and identity cards were also conducted, as well as strategies on the empowerment of the Baka through the sale of farm crops and the creation of ecotourism sites for biodiversity conservation. We also provide academic support for schools.

The Assistant Coordinator, NKOPANI Yverick made the trip to Kribi to participate in the Extraordinary General Assembly of the Gbabandi platform and a new facilitator, Mr. Timothé EMINI was recruited. His job description consists in helping the members of the said platform to seek funding and technical support from donors and international organizations who defend the rights of indigenous people.

On the other hand, the presentation of the Indigenous Phase II Model Project was also discussed. This collaborative initiative in partnership with the European Union (EU) was developed and managed by a global consortium consisting of IWGIA, Tebtebba, AIPP, Forest Peoples Program and the Danish Institute for Human Rights. These are a series of tools for (and developed by) indigenous people, in order to systematically monitor the level of recognition and implementation of their rights.

The Assistant Coordinator expressed the need to train and empower the members of the Dadé Kaolé Association as well.

Our Assistant Coordinator, NKOPANI Yverick was in the following villages: Ndjangué, Bossenga, Lengué, Koubou, and Mokola, to educate their respective communities on children's rights. He focused on the duty of parents to issue birth certificates for their children, as well as the obligation to send them to school. These meetings mainly allowed the association to see the various challenges they face. It was noted that the failure to issue birth certificates was due to ignorance, lack of information and supervision. Above all, they could barely read and write in French.

Also, the high level of illiteracy was due to the parents' lack of resources coupled with the discrimination their children faced in various schools. Parents equally pointed out that the certificates obtained by their children do not serve them much.

Considering these difficulties, the Dadé Kaolé Association assured them that it will do everything necessary to ensure that birth registrations are effective in the various camps by making birth registers available to community leaders. Mr. NKOPANI also deplored the poor state of conservation of birth certificates among the parents who held them.

Activity: Our participation in the MoV meeting between MINFOF and ASBABUK

three protected National Parks of Lobeke, Nki (North and South) and Boumba-Bek

Project Course

Signed in February 2019 for a period of 03 years, the duration of the said MOU was exceeded and both parties agreed to its renewal. Our Assistant Coordinators, NKOPANI Yverick and LIME Brigitte were present at the meeting organized by the Ministry of Forestry and Wildlife (MINFOF) and the Sanguia Baka Buma'a Kpode Association (ASBABUK) which was held in Bertoua from 16 to 18 June 2022 to prepare the new terms of this agreement.

The objective of this meeting was to review the implementation of the said MoV and present to the public the resolutions of the meeting held on January 19, 2022 with the Minister of Forestry. The latter agreed to its renewal. At the request of MINFOF, a consortium of experienced CSOs was set up to carry out the renewal process under the coordination of RACOPY.

This MoV aims to restore access and use of key biological and cultural resources by the Baka within the protected zones of the three National Parks of Lobeke, Nki (North and South sectors) and Boumba-Bek.

Throughout these exchanges, Mr. NKOPANI expressed appreciation for the amount of work done and presented the DADE KAOLE Association by offering its contribution to the camps located in Messok. Its various members met in Abong Mbang in July 2022 for a mid-term evaluation of the said MoV during the 71st General Assembly of RACOPY.

Activity: Sanitation and Maintenance of water systems

Objective(s): Improving Water access, cleaning and sanitizing water supply points; reducing the effects of waterborne diseases, especially among children and young people.

Noting the recurrence of waterborne diseases within the locality of Ndjangué, the Dadé Kaolé Association and the Baka community of Ndjangué held a meeting on June 29, 2022 and agreed on a three-month interval cleaning program of water supply points.

From now on, every three months, community youths designated by the village elders are to sanitize and develop (if necessary) all water supply points in its surroundings.

This also consists of weeding around the site, removing algae and dead leaves above the water while ensuring proper flow of water.

This good practice will also be popularized in the other camps.

During this meeting, the various activities carried out during the first term of 2022 were discussed. There were equally open calls for applications regarding the recruitment of a consultant who will help the platform draft activity reports.

LIME Brigitte asked if any activities were planned in Messok for these communities. Mr. Timothé EMINI, the then acting facilitator replied that the DADE KAOLE Association came forward late this year following its membership which took effect only in April 2022. GBABANDI's Action Plan had already been made official, unfortunately. The Association may implement certain activities on behalf of Gbabandi during the 2023 action plan.

Activity: Follow-up on the proper use of solar lamps

Objective: Ensure the functionality of all solar panels

Cost: 10 000FCFA

Project Course

In accordance with the three month interval monitoring and maintenance program of solar panels, the Assistant Coordinator, NKOPANI Yverick ensured the control of all panels in the villages of Ndjangué, Bossinga, Djomtal, Lengué and Koumbou.

Out of the 12 solar lamps, nine are functional, two are defective and one is broken.

The defective lamps have been brought back to Messok and taken to Abong Mbang at the Total station, as they are still under warranty and can be repaired free of charge or exchanged.

The Koumbou camp whose lamp is broken will have to wait for the next distribution campaign. Mr. NKOPANI Yverick deplored the misuse of the said lamp which will result in plunging the said community into darkness. He used the opportunity to encourage localities that have kept their lamps well to keep them carefully for the well-being of their communities.

Project Course

It has been unfortunately observed that the Baka were being constantly cheated by the Bantu who tend to buy their crops at ridiculously cheap prices; the Dadé Kaolé Association decided to put an end to this malpractice by holding different awareness meetings with various communities in Messok, Bandoum, Bizam, by explaining the advantages of working as a tight community to sell agricultural products and cash crops at the best price. This campaign was strongly supported by Baka women who saw it as a real opportunity to empower themselves.

When asked about its implementation, the association promised to inform them in due time, as this activity is based on the implementation of some non-existent logistics, like the construction or renting of a shop.

Baka women also expressed their wish to do trade by barter by exchanging some of their crops for oil, salt or soap.

This approach is part of the empowerment of the Baka people. Indeed, the Dadé Kaolé Association wishes to set up a NWFP cooperative with the aim of labeling these products, and subsequently introducing them into a fair trade circuit. To this end, our association has submitted an application for admission into another association called SOLIDARIDAD.

The association went to Kribi, to attend the meeting of the RACOPY platform which brings together the Baka and Bagyeli indigenous communities for a better representation at the national level.

The Assistant Coordinator, NKOPANI Yverick introduced the association to all the members present at RACOPY. A copy of the statutes was equally sent with the receipt for declaration of association to the RACOPY Bureau. He promised to transmit the association's action plan for the year 2022 and to pay the membership fees.

Responding to the question as to whether this association is actually created for the interest of the Baka, Mr. NKOPANI stated that although the Association's President provides them with technical and financial support, all activities are carried out by the BAKA people, hence his presence at the said meeting, especially in the execution of all the activities of the Association.

At the end of the meeting, the Dadé Kaolé association officially integrated the RACOPY platform.

The academic empowerment of Baka children is a priority for the Dadé Kaolé Association which was invited to take part in the meeting held on November 26 in Bertoua within the framework of PAREC. Mr. NKOPANI focused on component One, which had to do with improving access and a quality educational system. This component includes seven themes, including four which refer to the development of community preschool centers with respect to educational standards.

Mr. NKOPANI highlighted the situation of the preschool center in Djangué which does not respect any standards and whose makeover would be necessary. He also decried the lack of teaching materials, as well as teachers. However, campaigns to raise awareness for Baka children to attend school are producing positive results. As an example, he mentioned those who are enrolled in high schools and colleges. Finally, he pleaded with the State to mobilize more resources for the academic empowerment of the Baka for emerging Baka elite, custodians of the interests of indigenous peoples.

It is within the CSR actions of Pallisco that the advocacy of the Dadé Kaolé Association focused on improving the school conditions of Ndjangué students.

Based upon a request from the association, some of the children attending school in the community of Ndjangué have indeed received school kits. The Dadé Kaolé Association wishes to maintain this kind gesture by creating a Pallisco Prize for the best Baka students of the sub-division of Messok. Discussions were initiated with the managers of the said company and they offered to participate in the census of all high school students and above all, to provide academic support.

Such an initiative is part of the actions aimed at reducing conflicts between both parties in the management of forest space and will be part of compensation measures for Baka people.

CONCLUSION

Although the activities were carried out between 2022 and 2023 and were implemented cautiously, they were very welcome and received a lot of support from Indigenous peoples. The Baka show a real desire to improve their living conditions and participate in the development and implementation of projects intended for them. They are very available and voluntary, which greatly facilitates their mobilization and contribution.

With an amount of 840,000 (Eight Hundred and Forty Thousand) Francs CFA, the association was able to carry out its activities whose implementation is thanks to the Assistant Coordinator NKOPANI Yverick, who is also Chief of the Baka community of Ndjangue and Mrs. LIME Brigitte who has a strong experience from several training sessions. Considering both of them come from the Baka communities, we are very happy with the benevolent manner in which they carry out the various activities entrusted to them, sometimes with almost non-existent means.

This year was above all, a year of information, awareness and our affiliation with the various platforms of indigenous people. We attended the General Assemblies of Gbabandi and RACOPY and paid our membership fees.

These memberships will allow us to connect with the various projects for the Baka whose implementation is limited to Messok, which was previously represented by actors from elsewhere.

We encountered some difficulties in terms of logistics due to the multiple trips of the Coordinators and an almost complete absence of telephone network coverage. In addition, there was also an unavailability of electric energy in the sub-division of Messok, which made communicating difficult. Despite these difficulties, our team was able to carry out its activities.

The year 2023 will be rich in activities, especially in the context of the empowerment of the Baka with the support of NTFP marketing groups and our partner Solidaridad. In addition, the Dadé Kaolé Association intends to launch a vast census to establish birth certificates for Baka communities.
